RE: SECOND READING of Temp. Ord. No. 1821 budget amendment for FY24

RECOMMENDATION: The City Manager recommends approval of Temp. Ord. No. 1821, providing for the first budget amendment of the Fiscal Year 2024 Operating and Capital Improvement Program Budgets.

ISSUE: Pursuant to Section 2-203(a), City Commission approval is required to amend the budget by passage of an ordinance.

BACKGROUND: Per F.S. 166.241(5), the governing body can amend the Fiscal Year 2024 Operating and Capital Improvement Program Budgets only via ordinance.

DISCUSSION:

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND (006): In February 2023 the City appropriated \$700K in Economic Stimulus Grant funding to benefit commercial property owners and tenants in the City with a focus on those located in the historic area between University Drive and State Road 7. The application process for the property owners and tenants was open in July 2023 which did not allow sufficient time for the funding to be fully expended. The City is requesting to reappropriate the unused portion of FY 2023 funds in the amount of \$740,000 to FY 2024. Additionally, the City is requesting \$640,000 to be appropriated from available fund balance for economic incentive for a total of \$1,380,000 in FY 2024.

GENERAL FUND (001): Per Resolution No. 23-130, in FY 2024 the Public Works Department joined a consortium of cities to participate in the Solid Waste Disposal & Recyclable Materials Processing Authority of Broward County, Florida with an annual membership of \$168,400 due each year up to three years.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FUND (415): In FY 2014 CIP Project #54025-Purchase of a Vacuum Truck was approved in the amount of \$420,000. Public Works received a quote from Environmental Products Group for the purchase of the vacuum truck in the amount of \$490,000 requiring additional funding of \$70,000 to proceed with the purchase of the vacuum truck.

<u>ANALYSIS:</u> The following items are included in the first Fiscal Year 2024 budget amendment:

Economic Development Fund (006) – Exhibit A

Revenues (\$1,380,000 adjustment)

• Appropriation of Fund Balance: Increase \$1,380,000 use of fund balance to appropriate funding in the form of Grants to Others as shown below.

Expenses (\$1,380,000 adjustment)

• Grants to Others: Increase \$1,380,000 Economic Incentive to appropriate funding in FY 2024 for economic incentive.

General Fund (001) – Exhibit B

Expenses (\$0 adjustment)

- Public Works: Increase \$168,400 for annual membership to the Solid Waste Disposal & Recyclable Materials Processing Authority of Broward County, Florida.
- Non-Departmental: Decrease \$168,400 to offset the expense for the annual membership to the Solid Waste Disposal & Recyclable Processing Authority of Broward County, Florida as shown above.

Stormwater Management Fund (415) - Exhibit C

Expenses (\$0 adjustment)

- Appropriated Fund Balance: Decrease \$70,000 appropriated fund balance to offset the increased cost of CIP Project #54025-Purchase of a Vacuum Truck as shown below.
- Capital Improvement Program (CIP): Increase \$70,000 for CIP Project #54025-Purchase of a Vacuum Truck; quote received from vendor requiring an additional \$70,000 to purchase the vacuum truck.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MIRAMAR, FLORIDA, APPROVING THE FIRST AMENDMENT OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2024 OPERATING AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BUDGET; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, based upon the periodic review and analysis of current budgetary commitments and obligations, the projected needs and requirements of the City and the recommendations of the City Manager, and with the concurrence of the Finance Director as to Accounting Principles, it is deemed necessary to adjust, amend, and implement the Fiscal Year 2024 Operating and Capital Improvement Program Budget; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment to the Fiscal Year 2024 Operating and Capital Improvement Program Budget is set forth in Exhibits "A" through "C", attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, Section 2-203(a) of the City Code provides that "if during the fiscal year, revenues in excess of those estimated in the budget are available for appropriation, the City Commission may make supplemental appropriations for the year up to the amount of such excess"; and

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WHEREAS, this Ordinance will provide funds for additional new projects and

unanticipated expenses, as well as for projects that have been previously approved; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager and the Management & Budget Director

recommend approval of this Ordinance, providing funds for additional new projects and

unanticipated expenses, as well as for projects that have been previously approved; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission deems it to be in the best interest of the citizens

and residents of the City of Miramar to amend to approve the first amendment of the

Fiscal Year 2024 operating and capital improvement budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF

MIRAMAR, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed

as being true and correct and are made a specific part of this Ordinance.

Section 2: That it approves the amendment of the Fiscal Year 2024 Operating

and Capital Improvement Program Budget as set forth in Exhibits "A" through "C",

attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 3: If any clause, section, or other part or application of this Ordinance

shall be held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid,

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such unconstitutional or invalid part or application shall be considered as eliminated and

shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications, which shall remain in

full force and effect.

Section 4: That the appropriate City officials are authorized to do all things

necessary and expedient to carry out the intent and purpose of this Ordinance.

Section 5: That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption

on second reading.
